Four Cups of Wine—symbolizing the Bib-
lical concept of the "Four Freedoms"

Morror—bitter herbs as a reminder of
bitter slavery to which our forefathers
were subjected in ancient Egypt.

Charoses—this mixture made of apples,
almonds, cinnamon, and wine, reminds
us of the mortar used by our onces-
tors for making bricks with which they
built palaces and monuments for
Pharaoh.

Salt Water—symbolic of the tears our
forefathers shed in bondage.

Cup of Elijah—symbol of the coming of
the Messianic era for Israel and all
mankind, when all men and all nations
shall live in peace and freedom.

Karpas—celery or parsley, dipped in salt
water, symbolic of the relishes our an-
cestors ate at their festive meals long
ago.

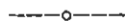
