IMPORTANT CHANGES IN PREREQUISITES FOR BAR AND BAS MITZVAH

On April 2, 1957, the Board of Trustees of our congregation passed the following resolution with regard to the eligibility for Bar and Bas Mitzvah and Confirmation in our synagogue:

EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, 1959, IN ORDER TO QUALIFY FOR BAR OR BAS MITZVAH IN THE BETH EL NER TAMID SYNAGOGUE, A CHILD MUST ENTER A RECOGNIZED HEBREW SCHOOL AT THE AGE OF 8, OR UPON ENTERING THE THIRD GRADE IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOL, WHICHEVER EVENT OCCURS LAST.

EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, 1959, CONFIRMATION SHALL TAKE PLACE AT THE END OF THE TENTH GRADE, OR THE AVERAGE AGE OF SIXTEEN. PUPILS ENTERING THE SIXTH GRADE AS OF SEPTEMBER 1, 1959, AND ALL OTHER GRADES BELOW THE SIXTH THEREAFTER, ARE INCLUDED IN THIS CHANGE.

The first resolution means that beginning with September, 1959, no child above the age of 8 may register in our Hebrew School. A special beginners class will be instituted in February, 1959, for all pupils who will be 8½ or 9 years of age at that time. FEBRUARY, 1959, THEREFORE, WILL BE THE LAST OPPORTUNITY FOR CHILDREN BETWEEN 8 AND 9 YEARS OF AGE TO ENTER THE HEBREW SCHOOL.

The second resolution sets future confirmations at the age of 16, or the end of the 10th grade. Thus, there will be no Confirmation in June, 1963. The first Confirmation under the new rule will be held in June, 1964.

HEBREW SCHOOL WILL CLOSE JUNE 13th

Final sessions of the Hebrew School will be held on Wednesday and Thursday, June 12 and 13.

Registration for the new term will take place September 3 to 5, inclusive.

FINAL AVERAGES FOR THE SATURDAY SCHOOL CLASSES ANALYZED

The following tabulation of final averages earned by the children in the intermediate and upper grades meeting on Saturday are of great interest to both teachers and parents.

These percentages take on added significance when one recalls that no writing is done in the classes because of the Sabbath. This, evidently, is no handicap to the students who rely solely on the outlines furnished by the teachers and the discussions carried on by the children.

It will be noted that a small percentage of children did not receive passing grades and another small percentage did not complete their work. These children will be given the opportunity to make up their deficiencies before the next term so that progress will not be delayed. They are to contact the director of the Sunday School department to make arrangements for this. Of course, if no arrangements are made, it will be necessary to repeat the grade.

One must agree that, on the whole, our children did very well this past year. It is hoped that the parents will encourage their children to continue Jewish learning during the summer months with an adequate reading program.
