His start in show business dates back to his army days when he was featured in the record-breaking bond show—"It's The McCoy"—which toured for three years.

His quick adaptability to any type audience has made Mickey a favorite from Coast to Coast. To name a few, he has appeared at the Saxony Hotel, Miami Beach; Chicago Theatre, Chicago; Chez Paree, Chicago; Sahara Hotel, Las Vegas; and the Golden Hotel, Reno. He has toured with Tommy and Jimmy Dorsey bands, the Stan Kenton orchestra, and the Frankie Carle group.
