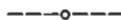

BAS MITZVAH

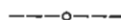

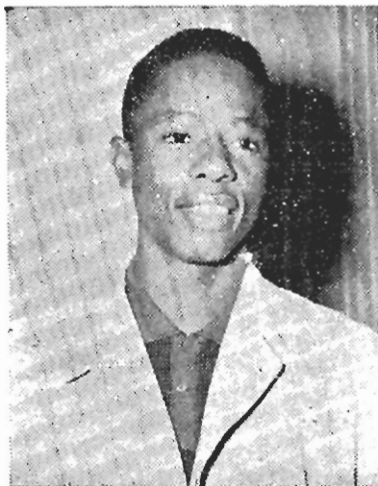

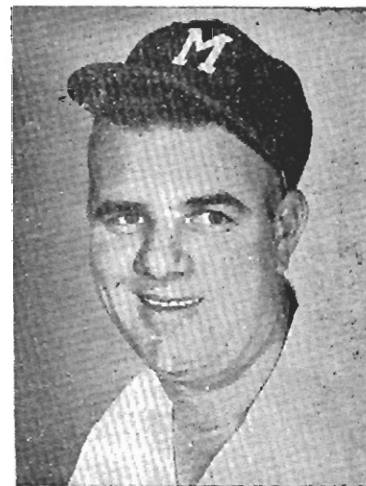

350 MEMBERS TO ATTEND CLUB'S BIG DINNER

The big, Paid-Up Membership dinner of the Men's Club has taken on new importance this year with the recent announcement of the election of Braves' Star Hammerin' Hank Aaron as the National League's Most Valuable Player, one of baseball's most coveted honors.

Aaron, Joe Taylor, and Tony Flynn will join the estimated more than 350 Club members, boy scout guests and sons of members at the gala affair, Wednesday night, Nov. 27, promptly at 6:15 p.m. in the Synagogue's Halevi Hall. The movie, "Bravesland, USA," will also be shown, following the speeches and program. The movie, Aaron and Taylor have been made available through the Miller Brewing Company; Flynn, the toastmaster, is director of Sports for Radio-TV station WISN.

One of the most sumptuous dinners ever staged at this annual meeting has been promised by Club President Sam Rosenberg and Committee Chairman Harry Kalmas. Due to the expected large turnout because of the fact that Wednesday falls the day before Thanksgiving, Kalmas has requested that the coupon on the adjacent page be clipped and forwarded to him by Monday, Nov. 25.

This is the first year that a charge is being made to cover only a small part of the cost, according to Sam. However, new members, listed elsewhere on this page, and those members who have brought in at least two new members will be admitted without any charge. The scouts in uniform will also be admitted free for the dinner and program.

It is expected that many of the club members and their sons will use the announcement showing the pictures of the speakers to obtain autographs. Word has it that Aaron's autograph is now worth four packages of bubble gum at neighborhood playgrounds. It will be an event worth attending for this alone.

KENDALL BOWLERS LEAD LEAGUE 4-GAME MARGIN
