SAUL EICHENBAUM APPOINTED DIRECTOR OF YOUTH ACTIVITIES

Mr. Sal Darff, Chairman of the synagogue Youth Committee, is happy to announce that Mr. Saul Eichenbaum has been engaged to serve as Director of Youth Activities of the congregation for the ensuing year.

Educated in Milwaukee, Mr. Eichenbaum attended the University of Illinois, Milwaukee State Teachers' College, and the University of Wisconsin. He holds a B.S. degree and a Master of Science degree in Education.

Presently an instructor at the Cumberland School, Mr. Eichenbaum was in charge of youth groups at Temples Shalom and Emanu-El of this city. He was also Unit Head of the Jewish Center Day Camp, and was in charge of assistant and regular counselors.

Mr. Eichenbaum has already commenced with the task of re-activating and reorganizing the Noar Group, for youngsters ages 13 to 15, and U.S.Y., comprising High School Sophomores, Juniors, and Seniors. The Noar Group meets every other Saturday evening, while the U.S.Y. meets in the Youth Lounge every Sunday evening from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m.

HEBREW SCHOOL ENROLLMENT REACHES 358

Exceeding all previous registration records, the Beth El Ner Tamid Hebrew School now comprises a total of 358 students, attending Hebrew School three times a week for a period of 2 hours per session. The school faculty has grown to 7 full-time instructors, under the direction of Rabbi Louis J. Swichkow, who is director of the Hebrew School.

Forty-five percent of the total student enrollment consists of girls. Of the 121 children who began Hebrew School last month, 51% are girls, setting a new trend and giving concrete evidence that more and more parents have begun to realize that Jewish education for girls is as vitally important as it is for boys.

Our Hebrew School faculty includes: Rabbi Maurice Cornfield, Mr. Max Weinschenk, Mr. Irving Gendelman, Mr. Sam Silberstein, Mr. Joseph Rothstein, Mr. Haim Komner, and Miss Cilia Gilon. In addition, Mr. Jack Knioz is in charge of singing instruction for all classes beyond the first grade.

CLUB FISCAL AFFAIRS REACH NEW HEIGHTS

More members than ever before in the seven year history of the Men's Club is the record announced by Financial Secretary Howard Bern. With 351 members already signed up, the roster includes almost half of the Synagogue's families. The secretary also indicates that although dues collections are ahead of past years, there are still some who have not paid their current dues. He has been asked by the board of directors to try to clear this matter up in the next 30 days.

Bern's department was also responsible for the resounding financial success of the Men's Club New Year's greeting card. Led by Ben Arenson and Meyer Weiss, and copably backed up by a team of women, spearheaded by Angie Sheft and Hannah Arenson, more than \$1,800.00 was added to the treasury by their combined efforts. At least 40 other persons were involved in the project, including Lou Silverglade and Irv Silberman who handled the production. The latter was arranged for by Silverglade through various commercial connections at a minimum cost, thereby assuring the maximum profit in the venture.

WORLD SERIES FILM TO BE FEATURED IN PROGRAM SOON

The banner year promised by the Men's Club program committee, under the direction of Harry Kolmas, has already produced two outstanding events with World Series film to be shown sometime in the near future.

One of the most highly successful Post Yam Kippur dances in years was the season's first affair sponsored by the club and more than 400 happy folks were attendance. At least half of the dance were college students and they helped materially to liven up the holiday weekend. Dove Waldman's appearance before his well-known dance band was the last. The veteran music leader will not devote full time to his accounting practice and his growing family.

The entertainment committee also arranged for the one-night gin rummy tournament staged at the October meeting. According to Kolmas, the card competition and prizes drew a banner attendance to the session.

Kolmas announced that this year's Chanukah "latke party", long one of the Synagogue's most popular gatherings for young and old, will be restricted to Men's Club members and their children only. The 1956 party led to an overflow turnout, causing confusion and injured feelings to many late arrivals. The restriction to members this December will help make the party more manageable and enjoyable.

Two more meetings on the agenda round out a busy schedule which promises to be well received. Kolmas is organizing for an early showing of the 1955 World Series film through one of the local breweries, and the annual sports night featuring such luminaries as Ernie Johnson, Johnny Logan, Bob Forte and Blaine Walsh will be a part of the paid-up membership dinner, taking place on the fourth Tuesday of November. The latter will be free to all regular members bringing in two or more new recruits to the club. A nominal charge for the meal will be made to all others.
