Rabbi's Message

(This teaching is in honor of Sareve Dukat, who was killed when the second plane struck the World Trade Center.)



This month marks the 10th anniversary of what we now call 9/11. As a geographically isolated nation, the scale and unthinkable intention of those attacks inducted us into a world that Israelis, Europeans, Africans, Asians and others have lived in for a longtime.

Your ancestors and mine lived in that world. Pogroms in Russia were the tip of the iceberg. Civilian casualties of the battles that raged across four continents were not even counted among the dead in the world's endless wars. "Slash and burn" was not civilian-friendly. And we have not even gotten to the atrocities perpetrated by organized religion that is innocuously filed under "anti-Semitism." As a people we have always lived in uncertainty. In America, in Wisconsin, we forget.

In thinking about the upcoming observance this year of Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur, I have been thinking more about the aspect of the Asseret Y'mei T'shuvah (The Ten Days of Repentance) than any of the other aspects of the Haggim. Having lived in Israel, I know how fortunate my life in America has been. I do not feel, as I feel in Israel, that I am living on the knife's edge.

But the theme of the Haggim (as this period is traditionally known) is that your life does hang in the balance. Whether you believe that there is a literal register of life and death into which you are entered for the coming year or whether you believe that it is an annual stock-taking or course correction, the Haggim are supposed to bring us up short and dispel the illusion that it is always business as usual.

However, it is not about gloom and doom. This heightened awareness of how much is out of our control is designed to make us even more aware of what is IN our control: how we view our lives and what we do with them. It is not designed to increase morbidity but to energize us to treasure more every moment we have and do more with our hearts, minds, bodies and souls.

Psalm 90, verse 12 says: "Teach us to number our days so we may attain a heart of wisdom." That is what I ask, of myself and of you, as we approach this tenth anniversary and as we approach the Haggim. Help me be more conscious of each day. Help me to learn more, listen more, be more present, do more, connect more, and love more. Then and only then will I truly fulfill the meaning of this time in our year.

President's Message

The study of Torah reveals that every emotion or act of behavior is recited in one fashion or another in the five books of Moses'. The very first principal of effective business management is stated in Exodus parsha Yitro, when Moses is over-whelmed by the burdens placed upon him. Moses' father-in-law, Jethro, suggests to Moses that he delegate his authority to capable individuals who will help him share his burden. This is, to me, a great example to follow.

Book Review

DAY AFTER NIGHT by Anita Diamant

After reading 'The Red Tent,' 'Good Harbor' and 'The Last Days of Dogtown,' I was delighted to know that our Synagogue Book Club was reading her newest book "Day after Night".

I must say I could not put this book down, The Author created a cast of breathtakingly vivid characters - young women who escaped to Israel from Nazi Europe.

'Day After Night' is based on the extraordinary true story of the October 1945 rescue of more than 200 prisoners from the Arlit internment camp, a prison for "illegal" immigrants run by the British military near the Mediterranean coast north of Haifa. The story is told through the eyes of four young women at the camp with profoundly different stories. All of them survived the Holocaust: Shayndel, a Polish Zionist, Leonie, a Parisian beauty; Tedi, a hidden Dutch Jew; and Zorah, a concentration camp survivor. Haunted by unspeakable memories and losses, afraid to begin to hope, Shayndel, Leonie, Tedi and Zorah find salvation on the bonds of friendship and shared experience even as they confront the challenge of re-creating themselves in a strange new country.

This is an unforgettable story of tragedy and redemption, a novel that reimagines a moment in history with such stunning eloquence that we are haunted and moved by every devastating detail. 'Day After Night' is a triumphant work of fiction.

I give it 10 out of 10. Definitely a good read for young and old.

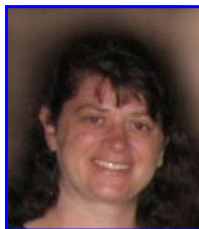

Family Education Center News

At this time of financial uncertainty, many feel the strain in their homes, amongst their grown children's families, at favorite places of business, in our own jobs, and even our religious congregation. The synagogue opens its doors every day due to the dedication of volunteers, hired staff, donations, and dues paying members. The synagogue's school is not just part of its budget, but is an integral part of membership, publicity, and educating our children. As it is my responsibility, the children receive an excellent program with passionate, knowledgeable teachers in a warm, family environment. We are small, but equally important as other synagogue schools. I am grateful that the school is continuing. We have three well deserving tenth graders that will be Confirming this year, as well as two students who will become a bar and bat mitzvah next summer/fall. This year, when deciding where to make a donation, please consider a contribution to the school. In the past, we have received aid in the form of bequests and from our school fundraisers. This year, the school children will be passing out apple and honey packages again to our wonderful congregation. This brings much joy to the kids and congregants alike, and we sincerely wish all a Shannah Tovah. This fundraiser usually brings in around \$500 in assistance, helping us to purchase high quality textbooks. We raise about \$1000 from our Fun Run/Walk, which helps provide programming to build character and motivation amongst the children. But frankly, to keep an efficient program, we need more. We have bills to pay and salaries to cover just like any place of business. Backing the Men's Club and Sisterhood also helps our school. We receive programming, financial support, and students receive scholarships from both of these wonderful groups.

If you ever have been in our building on a Sunday morning, you will see a lot of hustle and bustle-singing and learning, creating and playing, praying and eating, stories and programs. Here is just a bit of what our children will be doing this year. The 4-5 year olds will be learning through hands on activities and games, continuing with their introductory prayers, learning great stories of the past and about holidays, and be introduced to Hebrew letters. We will reinforce prayers with our bright 6-7 year olds as well as learn new ones, work on Hebrew letters and enter a bigger picture in regards to Bible stories and holidays. Last year, I started the 2nd grade on their formal Hebrew primer. Proving successful, the 2nd grade will be joining the Hebrew school on Thursday evenings. We will have a nice sized Consecration ceremony as the 2nd and 3rd grade students begin the journey into their formal Jewish education. One item of interest the upper elementary grades will be studying is their family history. The Middle School will be studying the Holocaust in great depth,

specifically making a connection to victims and survivors of their own age. Most Sundays will end with the children, ages 4-14, coming together as a community and learning about Israeli culture. To achieve this, they will learn songs, cook foods, dance, play games, learn new Hebrew words, do projects, and make art. Watch for a couple activities where we need YOUR involvement! The high School will continue their ethics class with the Rabbi. They will also be involved with a couple special projects and attend several outings.

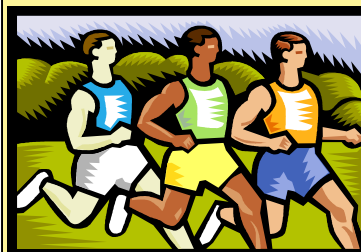
