Cantor's Message

TISH'A B'AV commemorates the destruction of the First (422 B.C.E.) and second (70 C.E.) Holy Temples of Jerusalem, which were both destroyed on the ninth of Av five centuries apart. It is a sad day in the Jewish calendar observed with fasting, the reading of Eichah, "Lamentations" and kinot, a collection of liturgical dirges composed by Jewish poets of different ages. The authors of the dirges gave vent to their feelings of Jewish sufferings and recorded in them the sad events of Jewish history. In other words, the fast day of Tish'a B'Av can be seen as a day of warning but also as a day of hope. The poet Issachar Miron penned it so: "Like Psalms, the day of fast renders a deft warning and sagacious advice to humans on how to prevent such an inhuman tragedy from happening again."



This year Tish'a B'Av begins on the evening of Wednesday, July 17. There are many reasons for us to reflect upon the tragedies that humans often inflict upon each other, including the terrible violence being wrought on our people in Israel. But this year, as always, Tish'a B'Av can be utilized to remind us that hope can spring from the rubble of destruction turning the day of deepest sadness into a day of opportunity for each of us to contribute to "Tikkun Olam" the perfection of the universe, or at least to our own personal universe.

We will be having a very special Tish'a B'Av service on Wednesday, July 17, at 8 p.m. This service will be held jointly with Congregation Emanu-El B'ne Jeshurun here at Beth El. Cantor David Barash, and myself, the synagogue choirs, and our congregants will join together in prayers, readings, and song to commemorate Tish'a B'Av. I urge you to attend and participate in what we hope will be a meaningful and spiritual worship experience.

The Burning Question About Grilling

Does a backyard cookout pose danger to your health? Cancer researchers have found that grilling muscle meat (red meat, poultry, and fish) causes the formation of carcinogenic compounds. When fat from these meats drip onto coals or flames another group of cancer-causing substances is formed, which can be deposited onto food through smoke and flare-ups.

Although animal studies have linked both substances to cancer, researchers differ about the risk grilled food poses for people. Some scientists note that it is difficult to translate animal studies to humans. They also point out that our bodies regularly dispose of small traces of carcinogens every day.

To protect yourself from possible cancer risk:

- * Grill at lower temperature, away from direct flame.
- * Use a marinade. Marinades inhibit carcinogen formation.
- * Trim the fat and keep pieces small.
- * Precook meats.
- * Flip frequently (as much as once per minute)
- * Remove all charred portions before eating.
- * Grill vegetables, pizza, tofu, or fruit instead.

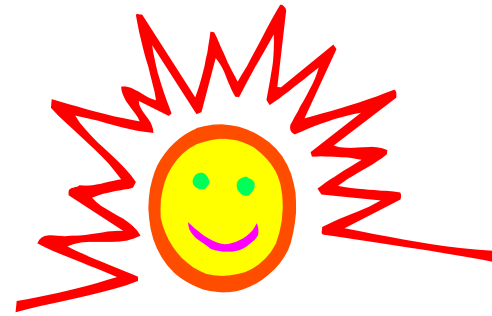
